To vote for all candidates of one party (a straight party ticket), fill in the oval next to the party for whose candidates you wish to vote.</p> <p>b. You may vote a split ticket by not filling in the oval next to the party, but by filling in the oval next to the name of each candidate for whom you wish to vote.</p> <p>c. You may also vote a split ticket by filling in the oval next to the party and then filling in the oval next to the name of any candidate you choose of a different party.</p> <p>d. In any multi-seat race where a party oval is completed and you vote for candidates of another party, you must also fill in the oval next to the name of any candidate you choose of the party for which you filled in the oval to assure your vote will count.</p> <p>e. If you wish to write in a candidate, where permitted, fill in the oval associated with the office and write the candidate's name on the line. Write-in votes are authorized only in certain races.</p> <p>f.
